 Complete your tasks on time and with care Your work must be completed by the deadline and follow the instructions given in class.  Use the English of the module Try to use the vocabulary, grammar, connectors and expressions we are studying.  Add your own ideas Your contribution should show something personal: your opinion, your imagination, your choices or your point of view.  Revise after feedback A first version is not the final version. Good writing grows when you correct, change and improve it.  Take care of your final work Before your work goes into the Journal, check your title, spelling, punctuation, layout and clarity.	During each module, you can collect Voice Points  You can get Voice Points for: • completing your tasks on time; • following the instructions; • using the English of the module; • revising your work after feedback; • adding your own ideas; • improving your text; • taking care of your final contribution. Voice Points do not reward perfect English. They reward effort, responsibility, revision and progress.	At the end of each module, the students with the highest number of Voice Points may become Student Editors. Student Editors will join a special Journal Lab meeting. During the Journal Lab, Student Editors may help to: • choose titles; • organise the Journal page; • select or prepare images; • check layout and presentation; • help prepare the final version of the module issue. You do not become a Student Editor because your English is perfect. You become a Student Editor because you work, revise, improve and take care of your voice.
